TAIL TRAIL CLUES:

- From the parking area, start at the path near the playground, turning right and keeping the play equipment on your left.
- When you reach baseball field #3, turn left into the grass and walk along the field on the stone path.
- Partway on the path, turn left into the grass and follow the lines of trees along behind the baseball fields.
- Keep field #2 on your left as you walk toward the buildings.
- Turn left at the white building and the post can be found at the lamp post.
- To return to the parking area, follow the gravel road to the parking area.

TAIL TALES:

- A group of zebras is called a “dazzle”, which also refers to the optical illusion when groups of zebras move quickly together.
- Zebras are black animals with white stripes, not the other way around.
- Each zebra has individual stripes that are unique and may help zebras recognize one another.
