Story Page Clues:

- ❖ Start at the stone path with the portable toilet on your left.
- ❖ The ball field is on your right. Follow the stone trail with Freysville Road on your left. Eventually you will see a pavilion/maintenance building on your left.
- ❖ The playground should be in view! Stop and play. Continue your journey by following the stone path heading up the hill past the next ballfield on your right.
- ❖ You should find a “Y” in the stone trail about halfway up the hill. Stay to the left.
- ❖ At the next intersection, go straight following the trail towards the woods.
- ❖ The post will be along the trail just inside the edge of the woods.
- ❖ To return to your vehicle, continue walking into the woods on the stone trail.
- ❖ Turn right at the next intersection.
- ❖ Go about 100 yards and turn right again. Walk out of the woods. Cross the bridge. You can see the parking lot from here.

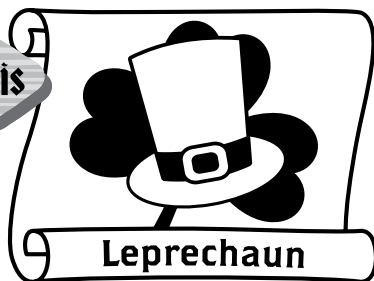
Story Nuggets:

- ❖ Leprechauns are considered part of the fairy family and there are no female leprechauns.
- ❖ Though leprechauns look rather funny, they have a reputation for being grumpy and grouchy.
- ❖ Early accounts of leprechauns describe them as wearing red and a variety of hats – often three-cornered. We now recognize them with the color green.
