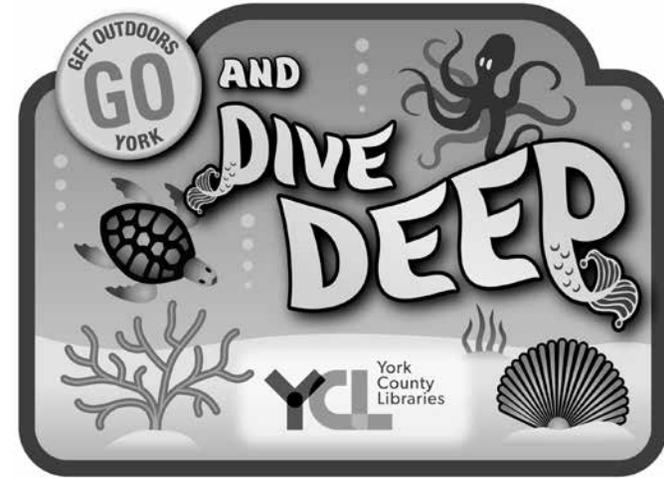

BONUS HIKE!

DIFFICULTY:



MODERATE

Distance: 1.5 miles

Dog Friendly: Yes

Location: York City Trails – Park at N. Pershing Avenue

ANCHOR CLUES:

- Park on North Pershing, along the street with Codorus Creek on your right. Walk to West Philadelphia Street and turn left.
- Check out the Little Free Library near York Friends Meeting House on your left.
- When you reach Beaver Street, carefully cross it and turn left to walk on Beaver Street.
- Spot the multi-colored tank on your left at Color Works and keep walking.
- You will pass York Academy on your right and turn right onto North Street Carefully cross the railroad tracks.
- Spot the Pullman Automobile's painting on the side of the building on your right, just before George Street
- Carefully cross George Street and turn right. Be sure to spy the metal structures on the way.
- Turn left onto Philadelphia Street, then continue to North Queen Street and turn right to cross Philadelphia Street to the library. The post will be outside the children's entrance, by the bike rack. From the post at the children's entrance, continue in the same direction to head toward Market Street, then turn right.
- Continue past the Yorktowne Hotel and the County Courthouse and carefully cross North George Street.
- When you reach Cherry Lane, turn right and walk toward Central Market House. Feel free to stop in for a special treat.
- When you reach Philadelphia Street, spy the seashell painting and turn left.
- Check out all the cute shops as you walk down Philadelphia Street. Cross Philadelphia Street at Beaver Street and return to the parking area.

DIRECTIONS TO THE PARKING AREA:

Beginning at Continental Square, head east on East Market Street toward Duke Street. Turn left at the first intersection onto North Duke Street. At the next intersection, turn left onto East Philadelphia Street. After three blocks, turn right onto North Pershing Avenue and park along the street.

HOW TO USE THIS RUBBING SHEET:

Follow these clues, just like you did for the other hikes. When you find the anchor, you'll see a plate with embossed artwork on it. Place the area of this sheet that says "15 YEARS" over top of the plate, and rub gently over the surface of the paper with a crayon or pencil to make the art appear.

PEARLS OF WISDOM:

- For each hike in the first year of the York program, ***Catch the Activity Bug!*** in 2008, participants needed to find a box containing a rubber stamp, which they used to stamp each insect drawing into their program guide. Rubbing sheets have been used ever since.
- The very first hike in 2008 was to find "Ant" in York Township Park. The most recent hike is the one you're doing, the "Bonus" hike in downtown York in 2022.
- In 15 years of the York program, there have been 451 hikes planned out in parks and areas around York County by the program's administrators.
- Those 15 years of hikes represent a total of 471.37 miles of trails hiked by program participants (including this hike).
- How many different parks and sites have been visited in those 15 years? If you did all of the hikes, you would have traveled to 83 different parks and sites in York County alone.
